KEEP THESE DOCUMENTS READY & COPIES SAFE

▼ Birth Certificate

Request a certified copy from your County Clerk's Office. Keep origanal sealed at home and a copy in your wallet or bag.

☑ GET A REAL ID

Visit your local DMV or Secretary of State office. Bring proof of address, Social Security card, and birth certificate.

U.S. Passport (or Passport Card)

Apply at a post office or county clerk passport office. Adult passport: \$130 fee. Keep photocopies in your wallet or phone.

Proof of Residence

Keep the original safe at home; carry only a copy or know the number.

Emergency Contact List

Names + numbers of family, lawyer, or community advocate.

SAFETY & PREPARATION TIPS

- Keep originals in a waterproof envelope or folder.
- Take photos of each document and back up to secure cloud storage.
- Parents, place copies of children's birth certificates & IDs in their backpacks.
- When driving or traveling, carry at least your REAL ID and one proof of citizenship
- Teach youth how to speak up clearly: "I am an American citizen. Please call my family
- Stay informed, stay prepared, and share this guide to help others protect themselves and their loved ones.
